# NYS SLIGP APPLICATION

- NTIA administering a \$135M formula based grant program for planning, outreach and governance.
- NYS submitted our application in March. NTIA recently requested all applicants provided clarification and budget revisions. These were submitted last week.
- Awards are expected in July.
- NYS will use the funds to conduct outreach and education on public safety broadband and establish the potential user base for public safety broadband.
- Phase 2 of the award is to establish the state of infrastructure, site availability, networks and applications. Details are TBD by FirstNet.
- Funds are not for equipment or network build-out.

# FIRSTNET BOARD

- Last full meeting held April 23rd
  - Sheriff Paul Fitzgerald, a public safety representative on the Board introduced a resolution that would require a review of the FirstNet process to date and the transparency to public safety. The resolution was tabled.
- At a special May 8<sup>th</sup> FirstNet meeting teleconference, the Board established a review committee to review the concerns and report back.
- Next Board meeting is June 4<sup>th</sup>. Meetings are normally webcast.

# STATEWIDE INTEROPERABILITY COMMUNICATIONS GRANT

- A **competitive grant** funded by state cellular surcharge revenue. Intended to help counties improve ability for first responders to communicate with each other and create a network of regional partnerships and systems that will include State agencies.
  
- **SFY 2010-11**                      **\$20 million**
  
- **SFY 2011-12**                      **\$45 Million**
  - Per statutory amendments in 2011
    - ***\$36 mil*** dedicated for further development of statewide interoperable communications for public safety – SICG (Statewide Interoperable Communications Grant)
    - ***\$9 mil*** dedicated for proposals relating to Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP) operations – PSAP Grant
  
- **SFY 2012-13**                      **\$75 million**
  - ***\$66 mil and 9 million***

# SICG ROUND 1 AND 2 METRICS

- Total Awards
  - Round 1 = 16 Counties (\$20 Million)
  - Round 2 = 29 Counties (\$102 Million)
- Total # Counties Applying
  - Round 1 = 45
  - Round 2 = 49
- Counties Receiving Awards in Both Rounds = 10
  - Cortland, Delaware, Essex, Genesee, Madison, Niagara, Onondaga, Schoharie, Steuben, Sullivan

# NON-PARTICIPATION

- Counties which did NOT apply
  - Round 1 = 13
  - Round 2 = 9
  - Did Not apply for either Round = 4
    - Chenango, Dutchess, Herkimer, Putnam
- Counties who have applied, but not been funded in either Round
  - Applied in both Rounds = 11
    - Allegany, Cattaraugus, Cayuga, Franklin, Fulton, Jefferson, Livingston, Montgomery, Schenectady, Seneca, Westchester
  - Applied in only 1 Round = 8
    - Broome, Columbia, Hamilton, Lewis, Oneida, Oswego, Saratoga, St. Lawrence

# PSAP GRANT

## **NYS TAX LAW §186-F PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS SURCHARGE**

**\$9 MILLION HAS BEEN APPROPRIATED FOR THIS PURPOSE; ALLOCATED BY STATUTE AS FOLLOWS:**

**\$7 MILLION FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF PSAP CONSOLIDATION, IMPROVEMENTS AND ENHANCEMENTS (FOR PROSPECTIVE OR ONGOING CONSOLIDATION PROJECTS; OR RETROSPECTIVE CONSOLIDATION EXPENSES NO EARLIER THAN APRIL 2010).**

**24 APPLICANTS**

**TOTAL MONEY REQUESTED OVER \$18 MILLION**

**\$2 MILLION FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF SUSTAINMENT/OPERATING EXPENSES IN CONSOLIDATED PSAP(S).**

**13 APPLICANTS**

**TOTAL MONEY REQUESTED OVER \$4 MILLION**

# ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Applications must be submitted by Counties on behalf of county and municipal PSAPs, operating within their jurisdiction.
  - There is no county match required with this grant
- Each PSAP must certify compliance with Title 21 Chapter LX, Part 5200 Minimum Standards Regarding Direct Dispatch. (Enhanced Wireless 911 Certification).
  - Certification document must be submitted by a County with their application.
- Grant funds may be used only to supplement the portion of local governments' budgets that pertain to PSAPs, not replace any budgeted funds.
- County could apply only for one grant type:
  - PSAP Consolidation, Improvements and Enchantments Grant (\$7 million)
  - PSAP Sustainment Grant (\$2 million)



# STATEWIDE INTEROPERABLE COMMUNICATIONS GRANT - NEXT ROUND

- 2013-14 Executive Budget appropriates **\$75 million**
- Consortiums will work best when all members have the resources necessary to ensure active technical participation in the consortium
- Focus on counties who have not achieved success with prior grant applications to help complete the picture of the regional approach
- Vet draft grant guidance with Board and key stakeholders
- Developing grant guidance, additional statewide criteria for Governor's post-Sandy initiatives to be included.

(Call, TAC, Repeaters)

# COML CREDENTIALING

- Establish NYS plan for accreditation, badging, and recognition
- Baseline is National (FEMA) requirements
- Review of other states Best Practices
  - Include continuing performance/competency measures
    - training, events, exercises
  - Three year cycle
